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Dear Neighbours

As you will be aware, we have applied for a new premises licence for our restaurant against which a number of residents have submitted representations. Naturally, we wish to get on with our neighbours because, firstly, we are neighbourly people and, secondly, we hope that our neighbours will enjoy the excellent food and relaxing ambience within our restaurant.

To this end we have decided to modify our application to address your concerns. Attached is a list of changes agreed with the Police which I hope will reassure you of our intentions. The Police are now supporting our application. In addition, we have today withdrawn the application for live and recorded music. The application is therefore to enable the supply of alcohol and the provision of late night refreshment.

In addition, we note that neighbours have expressed concern further to car parking. While car parking is not a matter considered relevant to the promotion of the licensing objectives we have taken account of your concerns. In response we have come to an arrangement with Rev Thomas from St Marks Church. Rev Thomas has kindly allowed the use of the church car park for our customers. This should adequately address potential concerns further to car parking.

Not all of the representors provided contact email addresses so please feel free to share this information with your neighbours.

If the steps included in this email and the attached document reassure you of our commitment to being neighbourly, we would be grateful if you could notify Mr Derrick Laing (copied in to this email) that you are happy to withdraw your representation.
