

**Delegated Authority
Elderly People's Lunch Club Grant Awards 2019/20**

A number of discretionary grant schemes are available through the Council, aimed at assisting a variety of organisations and individuals through grant funding, one of which is the Elderly People's Lunch Club Grants Scheme. Each year, Elderly People's Lunch Clubs are invited to apply for financial assistance to aid with their running costs. The level of grant awarded is based on the number of members of the Club over the age of 60. The scheme is administered by Democratic Services.

Membership of Club	Less than 12	First 50	Second 50	Over 100

The criteria for applications are as follows:

- Grants will be made to Voluntary Clubs established mainly for the purpose of providing meals and/or recreation for elderly people. The grant must be used for this purpose.
- Elderly people are defined as persons over the age of sixty.
- Clubs shall keep accounts sufficient to show that any grant received from the Council has been spent for its intended purposes.
- Clubs may be required to submit their membership records and accounts for scrutiny before the grant is paid.
- Grants will not be paid to clubs having less than twelve members over the age of sixty.

Five Clubs have applied for a grant in the 2019/20 financial year. Elderly Peoples Lunch Club Grant Awards are funded through the main Grants budget under delegated authority. The delegated authority is under the Chief Executive's ostensible authority. Attached is the schedule of applications for 2019/20 with a total amount claimed of **£517.00**.

Anandmilan – Vadil Parivar Elderly Club	This Group meets twice a month and provides lunches, speakers, entertainment and activities aimed at low level exercise. The current membership is 89, of whom 71 are over 60 years old. A contribution of £2.00 is usually made per person per session towards the cost of hall hire.	Recommended Section 19 Local Government (Misc. Provisions) Act 1976. £121.00
Humanity International Charitable Trust	This Group meets every Thursday evening and provides food and facilities for elders to discuss different topics. Pick and drop facilities are also provided for some elders. The current membership is 55, all of whom are over 60 years old and all members are resident in Woking. No charge is made to users.	Recommended Section 19 Local Government (Misc. Provisions) Act 1976. £105.00
Pyrford Retired Men's Lunch Club	This Club meets once a month and provides lunches and talks by speakers. The current membership is 76, 74 of whom are over 60 years old and 74 are resident in Woking. Members pay an annual subscription of £20.00, a joining fee of £10.00 and for their lunches.	Recommended Section 19 Local Government (Misc. Provisions) Act 1976. £124.00
St Hugh's Luncheon Club	This Club meets weekly providing a 3 course meal, raffles and annual party. The current membership is 34, of whom 33 are over 60 years old and all members are resident in Woking. A charge of £4.00 is made per person per session.	Recommended Section 19 Local Government (Misc. Provisions) Act 1976. £66.00
St John's Good Companions Club	This Group meets twice a month to provide refreshments, an information service, speakers, entertainment and outings for members. The current membership is 51, all of whom are over 60 years old and 50 are resident in Woking. Members pay an annual subscription of £2.50, transport to each meeting of £2.50 and a meeting entrance fee of £2 to cover the cost of hall hire, speaker and refreshments.
