WEST SURREY FAMILY HISTORY SOCIETY – APPLICATION FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Executive Summary

West Surrey Family History Society was formed in 1974 and has been holding an annual Family History Fair in Woking. At the Fair, there are talks provided and stallholders who offer information on general research and specific topics such as the Armed Forces, old photographs, old handwriting and DNA. The Group has around 650 users in total, of whom 75 are based in Woking. The Fair due to be held in November 2020 was cancelled due to Covid-19.

The Fairs have previously been funded from general annual income, with a small amount charged to other stallholders. All visitors can attend free of charge. During the last few years the costs incurred have increased and the Group has been relying on its reserves to meet a shortfall, and notes that it would like to seek external funding to help cover the full cost. In 2021 there is a projected deficit of £1,500 against a bank balance of circa £25,000, equating to almost two years' annual expenditure.

The Society is applying for a grant of £2,000 towards the Fair to be held in November 2021 at Woking Leisure Centre. It is noted that the event is well attended and organised, with the chance for visitors to seek knowledge from the experience of stallholder and experts on hand to provide advice. However, in light of the ongoing constraints on the grants budget it is considered that funding should not be awarded to support the Fair. It is further noted that the Group does not currently have an Equalities or Safeguarding Policy.

It has the vision of 'taking the past into the future' and the following objective: "To collect, index, co-ordinate, publish and make accessible in the interests of genealogy any documents or records, with particular reference to documents or records relating to the ancient County of Surrey: to promote the preservation of such documents and records: to encourage the study of genealogy; to assist educationally by lectures or otherwise in record research." 1.2 Employees None. 1.3 Volunteers Approximately 100, whose activities include: Organising monthly meetings for the four Centres including booking speakers, publicity, welcoming guests and providing refreshments. Writing articles, producing and editing the quarterly magazine "Root & Branch". Organising the annual Family History Fair at Woking Leisure Centre including inviting organisations to attend, booking speakers, liaising with the Leisure Centre regarding hall layout and facilities, producing a floorplan and organising volunteers on the day. Indexing numerous records about Surrey and producing the Society's publications. Taking the Bookstall to other family history events mainly in the south east of the country but sometimes further afield such as Dorset, Wiltshire and Birmingham. Looking after the website and Facebook and Twitter pages. Providing help, assistance and advice to members with their research. 1.9 Community Benefit	Around 400 to 500 people would be able to access help and assistance with research from experts on the various Help Desks at the Fair, listen to specialist talks on historical research topics, access the Society's indexes and reference library and receive help and advice from other stallholders.			
1.10 Covid-19 Impact	The annual Fair due to take place on 7 November 2020 at Woking Leisure Centre has been cancelled, alongside all the Group's other events and monthly meetings from March to December 2020. This has reduced the income from sales of publications. Two Zoom talks are being arranged each month for the Group's members.			

2.0 Financial Background		
2.1 Budget	At the time of the application, the Group held £25,000 in the bank. The Group aims to set aside the sum of £10,000 for expenditure in organising its Fairs and costs such as printings its quarterly magazines.	
	The Group has submitted a budget for 2021/22 which shows an anticipated income of £11,890 against an anticipated expenditure of £13,525, resulting in an anticipated deficit of £1,635.	
	Anticipated income includes subscriptions (£7,000), royalties and online income (£3,500) and Gift Aid (£1,160). Items of expenditure	

	include Root and Branch Journal (£6,500), centre meetings (£2,450) and storage (£3,500).
2.2 Accounts	The Group has submitted draft accounts for 2019/20 which show an income of £13,565 (£14,617 in 2018/19) against expenditure of £15,135 (£15,667 in 2018/19), resulting in a deficit of £1,570 (a deficit of £1,050 in 2018/19). The sum of £25,670 was carried forward at the end of the 2019/20 year.

The Fairs have previously been funded from general annual income, with a small amount charged to other stallholders. All visitors can attend free of charge. During the last few years the costs have increased and the Group has been relying on its reserves. The Society does not carry out any direct fundraising though promotes itself with a view to increasing membership at family and local history events, held at Alexandra Palace, Sandown Park, Staines, Dorking and Brookwood Cemetery.

The Society is therefore applying for a grant of £2,000 towards the Fair to be held in November 2021 at Woking Leisure Centre. It is noted that the event is well attended and organised, with the chance for visitors to seek knowledge from the experience of stallholder and experts on hand to provide advice. However, in light of the ongoing budget constraints it is considered that funding should not be awarded to support the Fair. It is further noted that the Group does not currently have an Equalities or Safeguarding Policy.
